Do you know how to act when someone has a seizure?

It is important that you know how to act correctly if you see someone having a seizure.





₩ What should you do?¹-³





Ease the person to person gently onto



Clear the area around the person of anything hard or sharp. This can place something soft under their head.

Time the seizure. be given if recommended by their

🗶 What shouldn't you do?^{1,2}



Do **NOT** hold the person down or try to stop his or her movements.



Do **NOT** try to give mouth-to-mouth breaths (like CPR). People usually start breathing again on their own after a seizure.



Do **NOT** put anything in their mouth (people having a seizure cannot swallow their tongue).



Do **NOT** offer the person water or food until he or she is fully alert.



Call for an ambulance if...^{1,2}





The person has never had a seizure before.



The person is hurt during the seizure.



If the seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes or the person has another seizure soon after the first one.



The person has a health condition like diabetes, heart disease, or is pregnant.
